PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

Nicholas Goodwin has practiced in the field of Architecture and Building Conservation since 1986. On graduation, he joined the Canberra Office of Phillip Cox Richardson Taylor (PCRT). His early years saw Nicholas as Project Architect on a range of school and small commercial projects. A principal client during the period 1986 – 1988 was Canberra Grammar School. Nicholas also managed a number of conservation projects in this period.

In 1988 Nicholas moved to Albury to join the practice of Chris Davis Architects. Between 1989 – 1991 he worked as a design architect on the \$60M Albury Base Hospital project.

In 1991 Nicholas returned to Canberra and after a short period with Allen Jack and Cottier he rejoined the PCRT office. Here he was again involved in school and commercial projects as Senior Project Architect. Nicholas also undertook a number of conservation reports and conservation / architecture projects. In 1993 – 1995 he was the Canberra Project Architect for the \$12M refurbishment of the heritage listed Hotel Kurrajong.

In 1996 Nicholas moved to the Sydney Office of Cox Architects whilst completing a Master of the Built Environment Degree at the University of New South Wales. He was awarded the Sydney Cove Authority Conservation prize for his Masters thesis. On the completion of study he returned to the Canberra Office of Cox Architects, where he continued to combine his Architectural and Conservation skills successfully in projects ranging from new commercial through Conservation/Adaptive re-use to conservation assessment.

In 1998, Nicholas joined Eric Martin and Associates as a Senior Architect and Associate. In working with Eric in developing the new practice, Nicholas has been able to further his expertise in Architectural and Conservation practice. Since 1998 Nicholas has also been involved in:

- School campus masterplanning.
- Heritage assessment for a number of complex heritage site throughout mainland Australia, including Defence sites.
- Fostering ongoing relationships with a number of new clients.
- Conservation and adaptive re-use of heritage sites.
